As for events, we enjoyed fantastic support for our summer BBQ, on a scorching hot day, and more recently reinstated our popular Vide Grenier with all the tables sold out within ten days. Both events were well supported, especially by the teams of volunteer helpers, and both contributed significantly to ACIP coffers. These successes contrast with the cancellation of the Great Gatsby event which unfortunately failed to gain the necessary support from our membership and sadly caused some upsets within the committee.

For my part, having served on the committee for almost ten years I will now return to my primary role of webmaster. Most of you will not have noticed much change regarding the website and our communications system, which is a good thing as the transition from the former ageing and clunky set-up was hopefully seamless. The website and secure membership database forms the backbone of our communications with the membership and the resource should act as a hub for both new and existing members. The processes have also been simplified, in the hope that someone new will step forward in due course to handle our web and email communications.
