ACIP News update - August 2014


So much has happened since the Entre Nous of December last year. Here are just some of the highlights.

Opening our new 'home' - Le Bastion

Following the committee's invitation to celebrate the reality of our new 'home", the 'Opening' provided an opportunity to gratefully acknowledge the dedication of those members who have given many hours of their expertise and hard work to make Le Bastion something really special for us all. Led by our Vice-President, John Kuppens, the project to refurbish Le Bastion to meet our needs was completed in early January. This wonderful new venue is surely ACIP's success of the year.

We opened officially on January 9th with a very lively social event, attended by over 90 members, partners, sponsors and representatives of the Mairie. We opened on schedule, and on budget. More improvements are afoot as we use the venue and discover other needs – ceiling fans will be fitted to provide summer

and winter comfort, as well as additional task lighting. We will invest in a new, fully 'plumbed in' music/sound system and, once they are renovated, we will have five new matching tables.

Website



Financial matters

ACIP continues to enjoy a healthy financial position, boosted by a subvention from the Mairie, contributions from our sponsors and from bar takings. This means we can hold the annual subscription at the same level as last year - 25 euros per member – great value for what is on offer.







New ways to pay your subscription

We are introducing some changes to the subscription renewal process. These are designed to make it easier for you to pay, to streamline and speed up the whole process, and to save us time and money.

Please help us by paying your subscription on time - by the due date, **1**st **October, 2014**. You will now be able to pay in one of four ways. We hope these offer you a helpful choice, especially if you are out of the country at times or are not a regular visitor to Le Bastion. You can now choose to pay by setting up a Direct Debit or making a Bank Transfer to ACIP's new Membership Bank Account, depositing a cheque or cash at Le Bastion or posting your cheque to the ACIP Membership Secretary. However you pay, from now on you will receive an e-mail receipt with your membership number on it, rather than a membership card which has proved costly to produce.

You will have recently received an email – sent on September 1st, with full details of how to pay.
